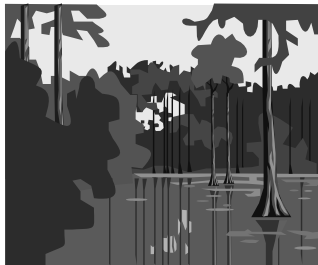

The Project WILD curriculum guides are classroom tested and research-based, and they are only available through attendance at a workshop. All the activities have been correlated to benchmarks of the Sunshine State Standards and have been demonstrated to improve FCAT test scores.
