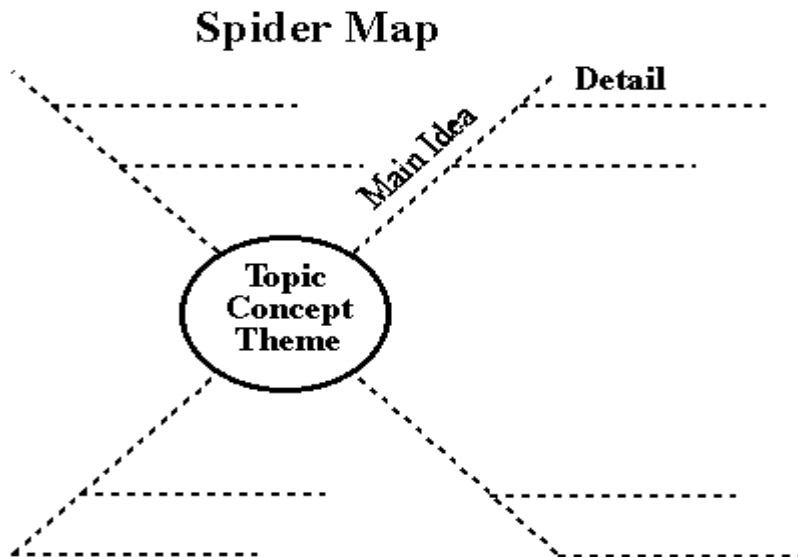


Graphic Organizers
